5. STATUS AND DESCRIPTION

- The event forms round one of the 2022 SA Rally-Raid Championship.
 SUPER EVENT. Ref SSR 303
- FORMAT AND PROCEDURE:
- The format for the event consists of scrutineering and electronic documentation followed by a **Qualifying Race** of approximately **25** kilometres for SA Rally-Raid National Classes A; B; P; G; D; E; FIA T1+;FIA T1; T; S on Friday, 25 March. The **Main Race** on Friday, 25 and Saturday, 26 March will comprise three (3) loops. Loop one (1) on Friday, 25 March will consist of approximately **80** kilometres. There will be a 20 kilometre liaison from the ceremonial start at DSP to the actual start of Loop one (1) and a 20 kilometre liaison from the end of Loop one (1) back to DSP. Loop two and three (2 & 3) on Saturday, 26 March will consist of approximately **130** kilometres. There will be a 4 kilometre liaison from the ceremonial start at DSP to the actual start of Loop two (2) and three (3) and a 4 kilometre liaison from the end of Loop two (2) and (3) back to DSP. Total race distance approximately **365** kilometres for SA Rally-Raid Championship classes A; B; P; D; E; FIA T1+;FIA T1; T; S. **Class G** competitors will complete Loop one (1) on Friday, 25 March and Loop two (2) on Saturday, 26 March, totalling a race distance of approximately **235** kilometres.

6. THE QUALIFYING RACE: Refer SSR 307, 310 and 314

- All competitors must complete scrutineering and documentation formalities electronically by no later than Friday, 11 March.
- The Qualifying Race for the event will commence as per SR 8 to establish a Starting Order for the Main Race. The Qualifying
 Race starting order will be established by the CEO of the SA Rally-Raid Championship, the COC and the Timing and Tracking
 Manager and based on the national seeding system.
- Competitors will be started as per the start list in one-minute intervals. There will be no groups and no time gaps. The starting
 gap between competitors is subject to change by the COC should conditions warrant it.
- Every SA Rally-Raid competing vehicle must have their RallySafe system and GPS activated prior to the start of the Qualifying Race. Refer SR8.
- RallySafe units MUST be powered up at ALL times. This permits the organisers to issue restart times effectively and
 ensure that start times are received timeously.
 If the unit is turned off, you will not receive the restart time timeously which creates numerous administration issues.
- If the unit is turned off, you will not receive the restart time timeously which creates numerous administration issues.
- Physical checking on the line will NOT take place unless there is an issue.
- It is the competitors' responsibility to ensure their start time is displayed on the screen.
- Competitors who did NOT finish the Qualifying Race, and are NOT intending to do the main race must return their RallySafe unit to Race HQ after the Qualifying Race. Refer SSR 318 A [xi] a)
- Should a download be required, you will be contacted by the COC, CRO or the Timing and Tracking Manager.

7. THE MAIN RACE: Refer SSR's 307, 310 and 314

SA Rally-Raid competitors will start loop one (1) on Friday, 25 March in two-minute intervals from the Start/Finish line in the
classification order established in the Qualifying Race. The start orders and start times will be published in a start list as per SR
8 & SSR314 [iii].

The top **ten (10)** drivers classified in the qualifying race will be able to choose their start positions for **loop one (1)** in a draw, with the tenth classified driver having first choice, then the ninth and so on. Start positions may be knocked up or down by subsequent driver choices. The start order draw procedure will be published in detail in the event Final Instructions.

- The starting gap between competitors may be changed by the COC if conditions warrant it.
- Competitors will go into Parc Fermé after loop one for technical checks at the discretion of the COC or TD. Thereafter competitors may remove their vehicles for loop 2 preparation.
- SA Rally-Raid competitors will start loop two (2) on Saturday, 26 March in two-minute intervals from the Start/Finish line in the
 classification order established in loop one (1). The start orders and start times will be published in a start list as per SR 8 &
- SSR 314 [iv].
- The starting gap between competitors may be changed by the COC if conditions warrant it.
- All SA Rally-Raid competitors are to ensure that their RallySafe system and GPS is activated and ready for the race.
 RallySafe units MUST be powered up at ALL times. This permits the organisers to issue restart times effectively and ensure that start times are received timeously.
 - If the unit is turned off, you will not receive the restart time timeously which creates numerous administration issues.
- Physical checking on the line will NOT take place unless there is an issue.
 - It is the competitors' responsibility to ensure their start time is displayed on the screen.
- A thirty-minute (30) compulsory decontrolled service stop at the DSP will be implemented after loop two.
 Refer SSR 310 [ii].
 - Competitors will exit DSP from the start/finish arch in the position they finished loop two and on the time indicated on the

time card. Please ensure you are in position and ready for the RallySafe countdown in accordance with the thirty-minute (30) de-controlled service break. Late out of DSP is added to loop three (3) race time.

No compensation for late out of DSP.

- The leading competitors in all classes will be shown the chequered flag on completion of the event, however, they will not
 necessarily be the winners of the event.
- Competitors will be classified as per SSR 307 [iii] ii).
- The time bar may be changed by the COC of the event. Refer SSR 307 [vi].
- On completion of loop three all competitors must report directly to the Parc Fermé. Refer SSR 310 [iii] and GCR 252 i), ii), iii).
- Only driver and navigator permitted
- No social gatherings with co-competitors
- Mask must be worn at all times
- Social distancing must be strictly adhered to
- Competitors to remain in vehicles as far as possible until race official duties are completed.
- Every National competing vehicle, whether a finisher or not, must return their RallySafe unit to the designated area at Race HQ after the main race. Refer SSR 317 [iii] iv)
- No paper incident report forms will be handed out or accepted
 Electronic incident report forms are available from the link on the Telegram virtual notice board. These must be
 completed before the stipulated cut off time. Refer SSR 317 [iii]
- Competitors who did NOT finish the event must return their RallySafe unit to Race HQ after Race.
 Refer SSR 318 A [xi] a)
- All competitors must return their RallySafe units to Race HQ after the event on Saturday 26 March. Should a download be required, you will be contacted by the COC, CRO or the Tracking Manager.

29. PIT ACCESS, DESIGNATED SERVICE POINT, ALLOCATION AND REFUELLING

- An absolute minimum of team personnel are to attend per competition vehicle:
- Under no circumstances shall anyone with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 (such as fever, respiratory symptoms, shortness of breath, sore throat, cough, fatigue or lack of sense of smell) or who has tested positive for COVID-19, be admitted to a motorsport event.
- DSP PARKING:
 - Each SA Rally-Raid National entry will be issued with a maximum of four vehicle access passes for the duration of the race weekend. NO extra passes will be issued.
- Pit access will only be granted to vehicles displaying the DSP ACCESS stickers.
- TRAILER PARK:
 - The trailer park will be located within easy reach of the DSP.

30. DESIGNATED SERVICE POINT

- The Designated Service Point will be at Village Green Cricket Oval, cnr. Hugenoten Str. (R540) and Beelaerts Str. Dullstroom. Please ensure that all team members are familiar with the DSP layout and direction of flow.
- All SA Rally-Raid National competitors will be decontrolled after loop two on Saturday, 26 March for thirty minutes (30) at DSP for servicing purposes. Refer SSR 310 [ii]

31. PIT ALLOCATION AND CONDITIONS OF USE

Social distancing must be adhered to and masks to be worn at all times.

- Competitors will be allocated pits. A list of these allocations will be posted on the Virtual Notice Board.
 Competitors are asked to be considerate when setting up in their allocated pit and afford other competitors adequate space.
- No socialising may take place during or after event.
- Team personnel shall confine themselves to their own pit areas, maintaining social distancing regulations.
- Masks must be worn at all times by all event attendees
- NO PARKING of TRAILERS will be allowed in the INNER pit due to lack of space. Please comply with this instruction.

ALL TRAILERS must be parked in the designated trailer park.

- Semi-trailers and transporters may park in the pit area under supervision of the DSP Chief Marshal and in accordance with the DSP layout.
- Competitors and their support crew vehicles are to obey the pit lane flow direction at all times.

32. REFUELLING

NB: THE PIT AREA IS A STRICTLY "NO SMOKING" AREA

- Competitors' attention is drawn to GCR 240, MSA Environmental Code Art 13 and 14 and SSR 316 regarding Refuelling Regulations. Attention is drawn specifically to the deployment of fire extinguishers. Refer SSR316 [ii]. Penalty 30 minutes.
- The use of Environmental Mats during servicing and refuelling is compulsory.

IN THE CASE OF A CONFIRMED SPILLAGE, A FINE OF R1000.00 (one thousand rand) WILL BE LEVIED AND THE RELEVANT CREW/S WILL HAVE TO CLEAN UP THE SPILLAGE TO THE LANDOWNERS SATISFACTION AND PAY THE COSTS THEREOF. Refer MSA Environmental Code.

Environmental mats will be provided by SA Rally-Raid in the Parc Fermé to be used by cars with visible leaks. The mats will remain the property of SA Rally-Raid.

• Please note that no hazardous waste (empty fuel/oil containers) may be disposed of in the refuse bins. All empty containers must be removed from the pits/DSP and returned to your workshop for disposal. Refer SSR 316 [iv] and SSR 318 A [x] f.

33. ENVIRONMENTAL

Refer to the MSA Environmental Code

34. FINISH

The Finish of the Mpumalanga 400 Races will take the form of a Timed Control. Refer SSR 306 [i].

35. PARC FERMÉ AND POST RACE SCRUTINEERING

- Only driver and navigator permitted
- No social gatherings with co-competitors
- Social distancing must be strictly adhered to
- Competitors to remain in vehicles as far as possible until race official assistance is completed
- A Parc Fermé in accordance with GCR 252 will be in operation at the end of the qualifying race and Main race.
- The Organisers may, at their discretion, carry out post-race scrutineering checks, Refer: GCR 254.
- Technical Inspections may be carried out by the Technical Delegate if required by the COC.

36. TIME BAR

- The DSP Time Bar as per SR 8 where after no competitor will be allowed to commence another loop. Refer SSR 307 ii)
- End of Race Time Bar Refer SSR 307 [ii], SR 8
- The organisers could also calculate cut-off times at various Marshal Points and Check Points along the route. These cut-off times will be published in a bulletin and posted on the Virtual Notice Board. Competitors, who arrive at these cut-off points after the cut-off times, will be instructed by the Marshal to return to the pits via the most direct route.
- The organisers will not be responsible for sweeping or the medical recovery of any competitor who disregards a Marshals instruction in this regard.

37. SWEEPS AND RECOVERY

• A radio/phone sweep will be conducted of the route and sweep vehicles will be on standby if required to pick up stranded crewmembers. Competitors are to note that the organisers are not obliged to provide a service for the recovery of vehicles or spares although they will endeavour to help where possible. Stranded racing vehicles and/or spares may only be recovered once racing has been completed. Furthermore, competitors/crews may only proceed onto the racing route after consulting with and obtaining written authority from the COC. (Refer: GCR 172 (iv) and (x), SSR 318 [xi] b) and SR 20.

38. COMPETITOR CONDUCT

- ACCIDENTS/ INCIDENTS AND MEDICAL BOARDS: Refer SSR 317[i] & [ii]
- INCIDENT REPORT FORMS:
 - Electronic incident report forms are available from the link on the Telegram virtual notice board. These must be completed daily before the stipulated cut off time. Refer SSR 317 [iii]
- RETIREMENT: Refer SSR 317 [iv].
- RESPONSIBILITY: Attention is drawn to GCR 113 (xiv) regarding responsibility of persons associated with an entrant.
- INSURANCE:

The organisers pay a levy on behalf of every competitor towards a Public Liability insurance policy that MSA holds, in the amount of R 50 000 000.00 per claim. Every entrant, competitor, driver or person associated with the entrant who is directly responsible for a claim arising from any accident/incident on the event necessitating a claim against this policy will be liable for the first amount payable (excess) of R 25 000.00 per claim. Refer GCR113 xiv).

39. ROUTE, ROAD AND RAIL CROSSINGS:

- ROUTE: The Organisers have been afforded the privilege of staging this event in the area and are reliant on the goodwill of the local community. Please do not abuse their hospitality. We also rely on the local community to provide manpower to successfully run the event and we request that you, your crews, family and friends act responsibly in order not to alienate the community in any way.
- Competitors are to keep to the marked route and ensure they do not damage crops, veldt, plantations and natural vegetation.
- The unwritten rule of the road is that livestock and game, which may be encountered en route, have right of way at all times. If you kill or cause injury to any animal, the incident must be reported in writing to the first official/marshal you encounter.
- Competitors are obliged to stop and render assistance in controlling and extinguishing any fire on the route, whether it is a vehicle or vegetation.
- Passage through Populated Areas. Please note that the maximum speed through a populated area (kraal or compound) is sixty
 (60) KPH and overtaking within these areas is prohibited. Refer SSR 306 [iv] g) and SR 308.
 Area/s will be indicated by boards, road book and GPS/RallySafe.
- Action will be taken against competitors and/or their service crews, who are found to have travelled on private property either before, during, or after the event, and/or travelling on the demarcated racing route, without the written permission of the COC. This will be strictly enforced! Refer GCR 113 xiv), GCR 172 (iv) and (x), SSR 311, SSR 318C.
- Crews are to be considerate towards landowners when retrieving stranded vehicles and/or spares from the route and are to ensure that damage to cultivated and grazing lands is avoided. Failure to comply will result in disciplinary action being taken against the crew concerned. It is important that crews familiarise themselves with the MSA Environmental Code in this regard. Refer GCR 113 xiv), GCR 172(iv) and (x) SSR 318 C [i] a).
- Any competitor who avoids or bypasses obstacles/ramps created in the Spectator Stadium Stage on the route could be penalised
 in terms of a minor deviation from the route. Refer SSR 318 A [iii] c).
- ROAD AND RAIL CROSSINGS: Refer SSR 309 and SSR 318 A [iv] b)

40. PENALTIES

Hearings at events involving race officials and competitors to be held electronically as far as practically possible to minimise in-person contact.

Refer GCR 153, GCR 177, SSR 317 ii) g), iii), iv), SSR 318, SR 19 and SR 20.

41. CLASSIFICATION AND RESULTS: REFER GCR 307, 197, 198 AND 200

- Provisional classification for the Qualifying and Main races will be posted on the Official Virtual Notice Board as per SR 8 Subject to no protests being received in terms of GCR 200 viii), these classifications will become final 30 minutes later.
- Competitors' attention is drawn to Parts IX and X of the GCR's of the 2022 MSA Handbook regarding protests and appeals.
- Should there be an unreasonable delay in announcing the results; the Stewards of the Meeting may postpone such an announcement. Refer GCR 280 ii

42. PRIZE GIVING: Refer GCR 121 (ix)

Prize Giving will be held as soon possible after the three leading class vehicles in the Production Vehicle and Special Vehicle categories can safely be identified.

Qualifying Race trophies will be awarded to the fastest SA Rally-Raid Championship Special and Production Vehicle crew.

All awards will be presented on Saturday, 26 March 2022.

Special Awards may be handed out at the discretion of the Organisers.

44. RIGHTS OF THE COC, THE PROMOTERS AND THE ORGANISERS

- The COC reserves the right (subject to the approval of the Stewards) to –
- Alter the departure times and route if forced to do so through weather conditions
- Alter the starting and scoring methods if it is found necessary to do so
- The Promoters and Organisers reserve the right (subject to the approval of MSA) to –
- Postpone, abandon or cancel the event for reasons of 'force majeure'. Refer GCR's 62 and 244). In the event of
 postponement for more than twenty four (24) hours entrants will be refunded their entry fee. Refer GCR 109 (iv).
- Postpone, abandon or cancel the event if less than a total of 30 entries are received at time of entries closing.
- Refer GCR 99 (v)
- Refusal of any entry. Refer GCR's 99 (i) and GCR 100.
