Held under Art 2.3 of the FIA International Sporting Code, the MSA General Competition Rules (GCR's) and Appendices, the 2023 MSA SA RALLY-RAID Standing Supplementary Regulations, these Supplementary Regulations (SR's), any 2023 MSA SA RALLY-RAID Circulars and any Final Instructions and/or official bulletins, which may be issued.

These regulations must be read and understood by all competitors.

## 5. STATUS AND DESCRIPTION

- The event forms round one of the 2023 SA Rally-Raid Championship.
- FORMAT AND PROCEDURE:
  - Standard Event Refer SSR 303 c) i)
- The format for the event consists of self-scrutineering and electronic documentation, followed by a **Qualifying Race** of approximately 50 kilometres on **Friday**, **12 May** for SA Rally-Raid Championship Classes FIA T1.1+; FIA T1.1;T; A; P; G.
- The race on Saturday, 13 May will comprise two loops. A South lap of approximately 80 kilometres and a North lap of approximately 80 kilometres to be repeated twice, totalling a race distance of approximately 370 kilometres for SA Rally-Raid National Classes FIA T1.1+; FIA T1.1;T; A; P; G. Loop one (1) and loop (2) comprises the South and the North laps. Competitors will return via DSP bypassing the pits to continue on lap 2 (North lap) to complete loop one. Entering the pits for any assistance between lap 1 and lap 2 will incur a 10 hour, outside assistance, penalty. Refer 311[v].
- KZN Regional competitors will complete the main race on Saturday, 13 May only which will comprise a South lap of approximately 80 kilometres and an North lap of approximately 80 kilometres to be repeated twice, totalling a race distance of approximately 320 kilometres for KZN Regional Classes A; B and P and will form round two and three of the KZN Regional Championship. Loop one (1) and loop (2) comprises the South and the North laps. Competitors will return via DSP bypassing the pits to continue on lap 2 (North lap) to complete loop one and round two of the KZN Regional Championship.

Entering the pits for any assistance between lap 1 and lap 2 will incur a 10 hour, outside assistance, penalty. Refer 311[v].

# 6. THE QUALIFYING RACE: Refer SSR 307, 310 and 314

- All competitors must complete scrutineering and documentation formalities electronically by no later than Friday, 28 April.
- The Qualifying Races for the event will commence as per SR 8 to establish a Starting Order for the Sugarbelt 400 Main Race Loop
  1 on Saturday, 13 May. The Qualifying Race starting order will be established by the CEO of the SA Rally-Raid Championship, the
  COC and the Timing and Tracking Manager and based on the national seeding system.
- The starting order for the Sugarbelt 400 will be according to the national seeding system after the Nkomazi 400.
- Competitors will be started as per the start list in two-minute intervals. There will be no groups and no time gaps. The starting gap between competitors is subject to change by the COC should conditions warrant it.
- Every SA Rally-Raid competing vehicle must have their RallySafe system and GPS activated prior to the start of the Qualifying Races. Refer SR8.
- RallySafe units MUST be powered up at ALL times. This permits the organisers to issue start times efficiently and ensure that start times are received timeously.
  - If the unit is turned off, you will not receive the start time timeously which creates numerous administration issues.
- Physical checking on the line will NOT take place unless there is an issue.
- It is the competitors' responsibility to ensure their start time is displayed on the screen.
- Competitors who did NOT finish the Qualifying Race, and are NOT intending to do the main race must return their RallySafe unit to Race HQ after the Qualifying Race. Refer SSR 318 A [xi] a)
- Should a download be required, you will be contacted by the COC, CRO or the Timing and Tracking Manager.

# 7. THE MAIN RACE: Refer SSR's 307, 310 and 314

- SA Rally-Raid competitors will start loop one (1) South Lap on Saturday, 13 May in two-minute intervals from the Start/Finish line
  in the classification order established in the Qualifying race. The start orders and start times will be published in a start list as per
  SR 8 & SSR314 [ii].
  - The top ten (10) drivers classified in the qualifying race will be able to choose their start positions for **loop one (1) of the Sugarbelt 400** in a draw, with the tenth classified driver having first choice, then the ninth and so on. Start positions may be knocked up or down by subsequent driver choices.
  - The starting gap between competitors may be changed by the COC if conditions warrant it.
- A thirty-minute (30) compulsory service stop at the DSP will be implemented after loop one Saturday, 13 May for all
  competitors. Refer SSR 310 [ii].
  - Competitors will exit DSP from the start/finish arch in the position they finished loop one on the time indicated on the timecard. Please ensure you are in position and ready for the RallySafe countdown in accordance with the thirty-minute (30) decontrolled service break.
  - Late out of DSP is added to loop two race time. No compensation for late out of DSP.
- All SA Rally-Raid competitors are to ensure that their RallySafe system and GPS is activated and ready for the ensuing race.
   Refer 300 [X] [v] and 310 [i] e).
  - RallySafe units MUST be powered up at ALL times. This permits the organisers to issue restart times efficiently and

ensure that start times are received timeously.

If the unit is turned off, you will not receive the restart time timeously which creates numerous administration issues.

- Physical checking on the line will NOT take place unless there is an issue.
  - It is the competitors' responsibility to ensure their start time is displayed on the screen.
- The leading competitors in all classes will be shown the chequered flag on completion of the event, however, they will not
  necessarily be the winners of the event.
- Competitors will be classified as per SSR 307 [iii] a)
- The time bar may be changed by the COC of the event. Refer SSR 307 [vi].
- On completion of loop two on Saturday, 13 May, all competitors must report directly to the Parc Fermé. Refer SSR 310 [iii] and GCR 252 i), ii), iii).
- No paper incident report forms will be handed out or accepted
   Electronic incident report forms are available from the link on the Telegram virtual notice board. These must be completed before the stipulated cut off time. Refer SSR 317 [iii]
- Competitors who did NOT finish the event must return their RallySafe unit to Race HQ as soon as possible after retiring from the event. Refer SSR 318 A [xi] a)
- All competitors, whether a finishers or not must return their RallySafe units to Race HQ after the event.
   Refer SSR 317 [iii] iv)
  - Should a download be required, you will be contacted by the COC, CRO or the Tracking Manager.
- **KZN Regional competitors** will start the main race (round two of the championship), on Saturday, 13 May in two-minute intervals from the Start/Finish line based on the Regional Seeding order and behind the SA Rally-Raid National competitors.
- Regional competitors must report to the start line-up 30min before their start time
- A thirty-minute (30) compulsory decontrolled service stop at the DSP will be implemented after loop one (1), and round two of the championship, for all KZN Regional competitors. Refer SSR 310 [ii].
  - Competitors will exit DSP from the start/finish arch, for round three of the **KZN Regional championship**, in the position they finished loop one (1) and on the time indicated on the timecard. Please ensure you are in position and ready for the countdown in accordance with the thirty-minute (30) decontrolled service break. **Late out of DSP is added to loop two (2) round three race time.**
  - No compensation for late out of DSP.
- Every competing KZN Regional vehicle, whether a finisher or not, must complete the incident report form.
- No paper incident report forms will be handed out or accepted
   Electronic incident report forms for Friday and Saturday will be distributed with the event Road Books and must be completed before the stipulated cut off time.

- All SA Rally-Raid competitors will be decontrolled after loop one on Saturday, 13 May for thirty minutes (30) at DSP, for servicing purposes. Refer SSR 310 [ii]

## 31. PIT ALLOCATION AND CONDITIONS OF USE

- Competitors will be allocated pits. A list of these allocations will be posted on the Virtual Notice Board.
  - Competitors are asked to be considerate when setting up in their allocated pit and afford other competitors adequate space.
- NO PARKING of TRAILERS will be allowed in the INNER pit due to limited space. Please comply with this instruction.
   ALL TRAILERS must be parked in the designated trailer park.
  - Semi-trailers and transporters may park in the pit area under supervision of the Logistics Manager and DSP Chief Marshal and in accordance with the DSP layout.
- Competitors and their support crew vehicles are to obey the pit lane flow direction at all times.
   Refer SSR 303 [iii] & SSR 318 A [iiii] d

### 32. REFUELLING

### NB: THE PIT AREA IS A STRICTLY "NO SMOKING" AREA

- Competitors' attention is drawn to GCR 240, MSA Environmental Code Art 13 and 14 and SSR 316 regarding Refuelling Regulations. Attention is drawn specifically to the deployment of fire extinguishers. Refer SSR316 [ii]. Penalty 30 minutes.
- The use of Environmental Mats during servicing and refuelling is compulsory.
  - IN THE CASE OF A CONFIRMED SPILLAGE, A FINE OF R1000.00 (one thousand rand) WILL BE LEVIED AND THE RELEVANT CREW/S WILL HAVE TO CLEAN UP THE SPILLAGE TO THE LANDOWNERS SATISFACTION AND PAY THE COSTS THEREOF. Refer MSA Environmental Code.

Environmental mats will be provided by SA Rally-Raid in the Parc Fermé to be used by cars with visible leaks. The mats will

remain the property of SA Rally-Raid.

 Please note that no hazardous waste (empty fuel/oil containers) may be disposed of in the refuse bins. All empty containers must be removed from the pits/DSP and returned to your workshop for disposal. Refer SSR 316 [iv] and SSR 318 A [x] f.

#### 33. ENVIRONMENTAL

#### 34. FINISH

The Finish of the Sugarbelt 400 will take the form of a Timed Control. Refer SSR 306 [i].

## 35. PARC FERMÉ AND POST RACE SCRUTINEERING

- Only driver and navigator permitted
- A Parc Fermé in accordance with GCR 252 will be in operation at the end of the qualifying race and Main race.
- The Organisers may, at their discretion, carry out post-race scrutineering checks. Refer: GCR 254.
- Technical Inspections may be carried out by the Technical Delegate if required by the COC.
- The Clerk of the Course may issue a written request to the TC to take fuel samples from race vehicles for comparison testing.
   Refer GCR 240 v)

## 36. TIME BAR

- The DSP Time Bar as per SR 8 where after no competitor will be allowed to commence another loop. Refer SSR 307 ii)
- End of Race Time Bar Refer SSR 307 [ii], SR 8
- The organisers could also calculate cut-off times at various Marshal Points and Check Points along the route. These cut-off times
  will be published in a bulletin and posted on the Virtual Notice Board. Competitors, who arrive at these cut-off points after the cutoff times, will be instructed by the Marshal to return to the pits via the most direct route.
- The organisers will not be responsible for sweeping or the medical recovery of any competitor who disregards a Marshals instruction in this regard.

# 37. SWEEPS AND RECOVERY

- A radio/phone sweep will be conducted of the route and sweep vehicles will be on standby if required to pick up stranded crewmembers. Competitors are to note that the organisers are not obliged to provide a service for the recovery of vehicles or spares
  although they will endeavour to help where possible.
- Stranded racing vehicles and/or spares may only be recovered once racing has been completed.
   Furthermore, competitors/crews may only proceed onto the racing route after consulting with and obtaining written authority from the COC. (Refer: GCR 172 (iv) and (x), SSR 318 [xi] b) and SR 20.

## 38. COMPETITOR CONDUCT

- ACCIDENTS/ INCIDENTS AND MEDICAL BOARDS: Refer SSR 317[i] & [ii]
- INCIDENT REPORT FORMS:
  - Electronic incident report forms are available from the link on the Telegram virtual notice board. These must be completed daily before the stipulated cut off time. Refer SSR 317 [iii]
- RETIREMENT: Refer SSR 317 [iv].
- RESPONSIBILITY: Attention is drawn to GCR 113 (xiv) regarding responsibility of persons associated with an entrant.
- INSURANCE:

The organisers pay a levy on behalf of every competitor towards a Public Liability insurance policy that MSA holds, in the amount of R 50 000 000.00 per claim. Every entrant, competitor, driver or person associated with the entrant who is directly responsible for a claim arising from any accident/incident on the event necessitating a claim against this policy will be liable for the first amount payable (excess) of R 25 000.00 per claim. Refer GCR113 xiv).

# 39. ROUTE, ROAD AND RAIL CROSSINGS:

# ROAD AND RAIL CROSSINGS: Refer SSR 309 and SSR 318 A [iv] b)

Competitors are reminded that it is compulsory to stop at all road/rail crossings.

- ROUTE: The Organisers have been afforded the privilege of staging this event in the area and are reliant on the goodwill of the
  local community. Please do not abuse their hospitality. We also rely on the local community to provide manpower to successfully
  run the event and we request that you, your crews, family and friends act responsibly in order not to alienate the community in any
  way.
- Competitors are to keep to the marked route and ensure they do not damage crops, veldt, plantations and natural vegetation.
- The unwritten rule of the road is that livestock and game, which may be encountered en route, have right of way at all times. If you kill or cause injury to any animal, the incident must be reported in writing to the first official/marshal you encounter.
- Competitors are obliged to stop and render assistance in controlling and extinguishing any fire on the route, whether it is a vehicle or vegetation.
- Passage through Populated Areas. Please note that the maximum speed through a populated area (kraal or compound) is sixty
   (60) KPH and overtaking within these areas is prohibited. Refer SSR 306 [iv] g) and SR 308.

Area/s will be indicated by boards, road book and GPS/RallySafe.

- Action will be taken against competitors and/or their service crews, who are found to have travelled on private property either before, during, or after the event, and/or travelling on the demarcated racing route, without the written permission of the COC. This will be strictly enforced! Refer GCR 113 xiv), GCR 172 (iv) and (x), SSR 311, SSR 318C.
- Crews are to be considerate towards landowners when retrieving stranded vehicles and/or spares from the route and are to ensure that damage to cultivated and grazing lands is avoided. Failure to comply will result in disciplinary action being taken against the crew concerned. It is important that crews familiarise themselves with the MSA Environmental Code in this regard. Refer GCR 113 xiv), GCR 172(iv) and (x) SSR 318 C [i] a).
- Any competitor who avoids or bypasses obstacles/ramps created in the Spectator Stadium Stage on the route could be penalised
  in terms of a minor deviation from the route. Refer SSR 318 A [iii] c).

- Should there be an unreasonable delay in announcing the results; the Stewards of the Meeting may postpone such an announcement. Refer GCR 280 ii
