These regulations must be read and understood by all competitors.

5. STATUS AND DESCRIPTION

- The event forms round three of the 2023 SA Rally-Raid Championship.
- **FORMAT AND PROCEDURE:**
Marathon Event. Refer SSR 303 c) iv)
- The format for the event consists of self-scrutineering and electronic documentation, followed by a **Qualifying Race** of approximately 61 kilometres on **Friday, 23 June** for SA Rally-Raid Championship Classes FIA T1+; FIA T1; T; A; P; G. The race on **Saturday, 24 and Sunday, 25 June** will comprise two loops of approximately 220 kilometres (East loop) on Saturday and two loops of approximately 214 kilometres (West loop) on Sunday, totalling approximately 929 kilometres for national Classes FIA T1+; FIA T1; T; A; P; G
- The event also incorporates the Road to Dakar competition. Toyota's sponsorship of the Road to Dakar, as part of the TGR 1000 Kalahari Botswana Desert Race, opens the door for local competitors to achieve their dream. Regulations to follow.

6. THE QUALIFYING RACE: Refer SSR 307, 310 and 314

- All competitors must complete scrutineering and documentation formalities **electronically by no later than Friday, 9 June.**
- The Qualifying Races for the event will commence as per SR 8 to establish a Starting Order for the TGR 1000 Kalahari Botswana Desert Race Main Race Loop 1 on Saturday, 24 June. The Qualifying Race starting order will be established by the CEO of the SA Rally-Raid Championship, the COC and the Timing and Tracking Manager and based on the national seeding system.
- The starting order for the TGR 1000 Kalahari Botswana Desert Race will be according to the national seeding system after the Sugarbelt 400.
- Competitors will be started as per the start list in **two-minute** intervals. There will be no groups and no time gaps. The starting gap between competitors is subject to change by the COC should conditions warrant it.
- Every SA Rally-Raid competing vehicle must have their RallySafe system and GPS activated prior to the start of the Qualifying Races. Refer SR8.
- **RallySafe units MUST be powered up at ALL times. This permits the organisers to issue start times efficiently and ensure that start times are received timeously. If the unit is turned off, you will not receive the start time timeously which creates numerous administration issues.**
- **Physical checking on the line will NOT take place unless there is an issue.**
- **It is the competitors' responsibility to ensure their start time is displayed on the screen.**
- **Competitors who did NOT finish the Qualifying Race, and are NOT intending to do the main race must return their RallySafe unit to Race HQ after the Qualifying Race. Refer SSR 318 A [xi] a)**
- **Should a download be required, you will be contacted by the COC, CRO or the Timing and Tracking Manager.**

7. THE MAIN RACE: Refer SSR's 307, 310 and 314

- SA Rally-Raid competitors will start Loop one (1) East Loop on Saturday, 24 June in two-minute intervals from the Start/Finish line in the classification order established in the Qualifying race. The start orders and start times will be published in a start list as per SR 8 & SSR314 [ii].
The top ten (10) drivers classified in the qualifying race will be entitled to choose their start positions for loop one (1) of the TGR 1000 Kalahari Botswana Desert Race in a draw, with the tenth classified driver having first choice, then the ninth and so on. Start positions may be knocked up or down by subsequent driver choices.
The starting gap between competitors may be changed by the COC if conditions warrant it.
- **A thirty-minute (30) compulsory service stop at the DSP will be implemented after loop one Saturday, 24 June for all competitors. Refer SSR 310 [ii].**
Competitors will exit DSP from the start/finish arch in the position they finished loop one on the time indicated on the timecard. Please ensure you are in position and ready for the RallySafe countdown in accordance with the thirty-minute (30) decontrolled service break.
Late out of DSP is added to loop two race time. No compensation for late out of DSP.
- The leading competitors in all classes will be shown the chequered flag on completion of the day, however, they will not necessarily be the winners of the day.
- On completion of loop two on Saturday, 24 June, all competitors must report directly to the Parc Fermé. Refer SSR 310 [iii] and GCR 252 i), ii), iii). **Only driver and navigator permitted**
- **No paper incident report forms will be handed out or accepted.**
Electronic incident report forms are available from the link on the Telegram virtual notice board. These must be completed before the stipulated cut off time. Refer SSR 317 [iii]
- SA Rally-Raid competitors will start Day two, West Loop on Sunday, 25 June in two-minute intervals from the Start/Finish line in the classification order established in Day one. (SSR 314 [iv]).
Competitors who did not finish Day one will start Day two as per instructions from the Clerk of the Course and a ten hour penalty. SSR 311 [iv]
Competitors who did not start **Day one** will not be allowed to start **Day two.**

The start orders and start times will be published in a start list as per SR 8 & SSR314 [ii].

All SA Rally-Raid competitors are to ensure that their RallySafe system and GPS is activated and ready for the ensuing race. Refer 300 [X] [v] and 310 [i] e).

RallySafe units MUST be powered up at ALL times. This permits the organisers to issue restart times efficiently and ensure that start times are received timeously.

If the unit is turned off, you will not receive the restart time timeously which creates numerous administration issues.

- **Physical checking on the line will NOT take place unless there is an issue. It is the competitors' responsibility to ensure their start time is displayed on the screen.**
- The leading competitors in all classes will be shown the chequered flag on completion of the event, however, they will not necessarily be the winners of the event.
- Competitors will be classified as per SSR 307 [iii] c)
- The time bar may be changed by the COC of the event. Refer SSR 307 [vi].
- On completion of loop four on Sunday, 25 June, all competitors must report directly to the Parc Fermé. Refer SSR 310 [iii] and GCR 252 i), ii), iii). **Only driver and navigator permitted**
- **No paper incident report forms will be handed out or accepted**
Electronic incident report forms are available from the link on the Telegram virtual notice board. These must be completed before the stipulated cut off time. Refer SSR 317 [iii]
- **Competitors who did NOT finish the event must return their RallySafe unit to Race HQ as soon as possible after retiring from the event. Refer SSR 318 A [xi] a)**
- **All competitors, whether a finishers or not must return their RallySafe units to Race HQ after the event. Refer SSR 317 [iii] iv)**

IN THE CASE OF A CONFIRMED SPILLAGE, A FINE OF R1000.00 (one thousand rand) WILL BE LEVIED AND THE RELEVANT CREW/S WILL HAVE TO CLEAN UP THE SPILLAGE TO THE LANDOWNERS SATISFACTION AND PAY THE COSTS THEREOF. Refer MSA Environmental Code. Environmental mats will be provided by SA Rally-Raid in the Parc Fermé to be used by cars with visible leaks. The mats will remain the property of SA Rally-Raid. Please note that no hazardous waste (empty fuel/oil containers) may be disposed of in the refuse bins. All empty containers must be removed from the pits/DSP and returned to your workshop for disposal. Refer SSR 316 [iv] and SSR 318 A [x] f.

The Organisers may, at their discretion, carry out post-race scrutineering checks. Refer: GCR 254. Technical Inspections may be carried out by the Technical Delegate if required by the COC. The Clerk of the Course may issue a written request to the TC to take fuel samples from race vehicles for comparison testing. Refer GCR 240 v)
36. TIME BAR

Refer SSR 307 ii) End of Race Time Bar – Refer SSR 307 [ii], SR 8 The organisers could also calculate cut-off times at various Marshal Points and Check Points along the route. These cut-off times will be published in a bulletin and posted on the Virtual Notice Board. Competitors, who arrive at these cut-off points after the cut-off times, will be instructed by the Marshal to return to the pits via the most direct route. The organisers will not be responsible for sweeping or the medical recovery of any competitor who disregards a Marshals instruction in this regard.
37. SWEEPS AND RECOVERY

Competitors are to note that the organisers are not obliged to provide a service for the recovery of vehicles or spares although they will endeavour to help where possible. - INSURANCE:
The organisers pay a levy on behalf of every competitor towards a Public Liability insurance policy that MSA holds, in the amount of R 50 000 000.00 per claim. Every entrant, competitor, driver or person associated with the entrant who is directly responsible for a claim arising from any accident/incident on the event necessitating a claim against this policy will be liable for the first amount payable (excess) of R 25 000.00 per claim. Refer GCR113 xiv).

39. ROUTE, ROAD AND RAIL CROSSINGS:

- **ROAD AND RAIL CROSSINGS: Refer SSR 309 and SSR 318 A [iv] b)**
Competitors are reminded that it is compulsory to stop at all road/rail crossings.
- ROUTE: The Organisers have been afforded the privilege of staging this event in the area and are reliant on the goodwill of the local community. Please do not abuse their hospitality. We also rely on the local community to provide manpower to successfully run the event and we request that you, your crews, family and friends act responsibly in order not to alienate the community in any way.
- Competitors are to keep to the marked route and ensure they do not damage crops, veldt, plantations and natural vegetation.
- The unwritten rule of the road is that livestock and game, which may be encountered en route, have right of way at all times. If you kill or cause injury to any animal, the incident must be reported in writing to the first official/marshal you encounter.
- Competitors are obliged to stop and render assistance in controlling and extinguishing any fire on the route, whether it is a vehicle or vegetation.
- Passage through Populated Areas. Please note that the maximum speed through a populated area (kraal or compound) is sixty (60) KPH and overtaking within these areas is prohibited. Refer SSR 306 [iv] g) and SR 308.
Area/s will be indicated by boards, road book and GPS/RallySafe.
- Action will be taken against competitors and/or their service crews, who are found to have travelled on private property either before, during, or after the event, and/or travelling on the demarcated racing route, without the written permission of the COC. This will be strictly enforced! Refer GCR 113 xiv), GCR 172 (iv) and (x), SSR 311, SSR 318C.
- Crews are to be considerate towards landowners when retrieving stranded vehicles and/or spares from the route and are to ensure that damage to cultivated and grazing lands is avoided. Failure to comply will result in disciplinary action being taken against the crew concerned. It is important that crews familiarise themselves with the MSA Environmental Code in this regard. Refer GCR 113 xiv), GCR 172(iv) and (x) SSR 318 C [i] a).
- Any competitor who avoids or bypasses obstacles/ramps created in the Spectator Stadium Stage on the route could be penalised in terms of a minor deviation from the route. Refer SSR 318 A [iii] c).
