5. STATUS AND DESCRIPTION

- The event forms Round Three of the 2024 SA Rally-Raid Championship.
- FORMAT AND PROCEDURE:
- Marathon Event Refer SSR 303 [ii] c) iv)
- The format for the event consists of self-scrutineering and electronic documentation, followed by a Castrol Qualifying Race of approximately 15 kilometres on Friday, 21 June and Stage One of approximately 100 kilometres for SA Rally-Raid Championship Classes Ultimate (T1+), Adventurer (T1), Challenger and SSV. Refer SSR 301.
- The race on Saturday, 22 June will comprise two stages (stage two and stage three) of approximately 200 kilometres.
 Sunday, 23 June will comprise two stages (Stage four and five) totalling a race distance of approximately 200 kilometres for SA Rally-Raid National Classes Ultimate (T1+), Adventurer (T1), Challenger and SSV.

6. THE CASTROL QUALIFYING RACE: Refer SSR 307, 310 and 314

- All competitors must complete documentation formalities electronically by no later than Friday, 7 June.
- The Castrol Qualifying Race for the event will commence as per SR 8 to establish a Starting Order for the TGRSA Safari 1000 Stage One (1) on **Friday, 21 June**. The Castrol Qualifying Race starting order will be established by the CEO of the SA Rally-Raid Championship, the COC and the Timing and Tracking Manager and based on the national seeding system after the PS Laser Promac Vryheid 400 Round 2 of the 2024 season.
- Competitors will be started as per the start list in two-minute intervals. There will be no groups and no time gaps. The
 starting gap between competitors is subject to change by the COC should conditions warrant it.
- Every SA Rally-Raid competing vehicle must have their RallySafe system and GPS activated prior to the start of the Castrol Qualifying Race. Refer SR8.
- RallySafe units MUST be powered up at ALL times. This permits the organisers to issue start times efficiently and
 ensure that start times are received timeously.
 If the unit is turned off, you will not receive the start time timeously which creates numerous administration issues
 - and possible late starts.

 Physical checking on the line will NOT take place unless there is an issue.
- It is the competitors' responsibility to ensure their start time is displayed on the screen.
- Competitors who did NOT finish the Castrol Qualifying Race and are NOT intending to do the main race must return their RallySafe unit to Race HQ after the Castrol Qualifying Race. Refer SSR 318 A [xii] a)
- Should a download be required, you will be contacted by the COC, CRO or the Timing and Tracking Manager.
- On-board Camera System. Refer Part 2 art 12.1.2 and 12.2.1

7. THE MAIN RACE: Refer SSR's 307, 310 and 314

- SA Rally-Raid competitors will start Round 2 Stage One (1) on Friday, 21 June in two-minute intervals from the Start/Finish line in the classification order established in the Castrol Qualifying Race. The start orders and start times will be published in a start list as per SR 8 & SSR 314 [ii].
 - The top ten (10) drivers in the Castrol Qualifying Race will choose their start positions for Stage one (1) of the TGRSA Safari 1000 in a draw, with the tenth classified driver having first choice, then the ninth and so on. Start positions may be knocked up or down by subsequent driver choices.
 - The starting gap between competitors may be changed by the COC if conditions warrant it.
- On completion of Stage three (3) on Saturday, 22 June and Stage five (5) on Sunday, 23 all competitors must report directly to the Parc Fermé. Refer SSR 310 [iii] and GCR 252 i), ii), iii). Only driver and navigator permitted
- Incidents: Electronic incident report forms are compulsory and available from the link on the Telegram virtual notice board. These must be completed before the stipulated cut off time. Refer SSR 317 [iii]. Racing incidents between competitors should be reported directly to the CRO or CoC no later than thirty (30) minutes after arrival at final Parc Fermé. Ref GCR 200 [vii].
- A thirty-minute (30) compulsory service stop at the DSP will be implemented after Stage two on Saturday, 22 June and Stage four on Sunday, 23 June for all competitors. Refer SSR 310 [ii].
 - Competitors will exit DSP from the start/finish arch in the position they finished Stage two on Saturday 22 June and Stage four on Sunday, 23 June, on the time indicated on the timecard.
 - Please ensure you are in position and ready for the RallySafe countdown in accordance with the thirty-minute (30) decontrolled service break.
 - Late out of DSP is added to Stage three and Stage five race time. No compensation for late out of DSP.
- All SA Rally-Raid competitors are to ensure that their RallySafe system and GPS is activated and ready for the ensuing

race. Refer 300 [x] and 310 [i] e).

RallySafe units MUST be powered up at ALL times. This permits the organisers to issue restart times efficiently and ensure that start times are received timeously.

If the unit is turned off, you will not receive the restart time timeously which creates numerous administration issues.

- Physical checking on the line will NOT take place unless there is an issue.
 It is the competitors' responsibility to ensure their start time is displayed on the screen.
- On-board Camera System to be activated
- The leading competitors in all classes will be shown the chequered flag on completion of the event, however, they will not necessarily be the winners of the event.
- Competitors will be classified as per SSR 307 [iii] a)
- The time bar may be changed by the COC of the event. Refer SSR 307 [vi].
- Competitors who did NOT finish the event must return their RallySafe unit to Race HQ as soon as possible after retiring from the event. Refer SSR 318 A [xii] a)
- All competitors, whether a finisher or not must return their RallySafe units to Race HQ after the event.
 Refer SSR 317 [iii] d)
 - Should a download be required, you will be contacted by the COC, CRO or the Tracking Manager.
- Every competitor, whether a finisher or not, must complete the incident report form.
- No paper incident report forms will be handed out or accepted
 Electronic incident report forms for Saturday and Sunday will be distributed with the event Road Books and must be completed before the stipulated cut off time.

- To observe whether the white and yellow lights of vehicles are functioning. Refer SSR 313 and SSR 318 A [v] a) and A [viii] b)
- To observe wilful damage to property and competitor and service crew conduct/behaviour. Refer SSR 317 [v] and SSR 318 C)
- To observe use of outside assistance. Refer SSR 311.

20. GENERAL

- Entries open immediately and close as per SR 8 by which time FULLY COMPLETED ENTRY FORMS ACCOMPANIED BY THE PRESCRIBED FEE must be in the hands of the Organisers. Entries not accompanied by the entry fee or which are incomplete in any material aspect will be notified that their entry will be held by the organisers, but not processed, until correctly completed and/or the entry fee has been paid in full.
- ALL EVENT DOCUMENTATION MUST BE SUBMITTED ELECTRONICALLY BY NO LATER THAN FRIDAY, 7 JUNE
 AND MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:
- MSA or International ASN Competition License for Driver, Navigator and Entrant if applicable
- Proof of entry payment
- The Organisers reserve the right to limit the number of entries to a maximum of 120. Refer: GCR 101 and 103. Entries will be accepted on a basis of 'first come, first served' and in accordance with SSR 300 [vi] a).
- Should a competitor be uncertain as to whether he/she will be able to compete, he/she should nevertheless submit
 an entry together with the prescribed entry fee. Should he/she be unable to compete, he/she must inform the
 Organisers in writing by no later than the start time of the compulsory competitors briefing. If the organisers are
 in receipt of such a letter, they will refund the entry fee in full. Should no withdrawal be received prior to this time
 the entry fee will be forfeited in full.
- Competitors and Officials are reminded of GCR 118 and GCR 130 re the consumption of alcohol. No alcohol maybe
 consumed at Marshal points or Race HQ while on duty and competitors only after the completion of the days racing, and
 until such time the final classifications are confirmed. Should you not obey this instruction the relevant rules and penalties
 will be applied.

The trailer park will be located within easy reach of the DSP.

30. DESIGNATED SERVICE POINT

The Designated Service Point will be at **Koedoeskop Laerskool HDDD.ddddd = S24.88367 E27.51836 HDDD MM.mmm = S24 53.020 E27 31.102**

- Please ensure that all team members are familiar with the DSP layout and direction of flow.
- All SA Rally-Raid competitors will be decontrolled after Stage two on Saturday, 22 June and Stage four on Sunday, 23 June for thirty minutes (30) at DSP, for servicing purposes. Refer SSR 310 [ii]

31. PIT ALLOCATION AND CONDITIONS OF USE

- Competitors will be allocated pits. A list of these allocations will be posted on the Virtual Notice Board.
 Competitors are asked to be considerate when setting up in their allocated pit and afford other competitors adequate space.
- NO PARKING of TRAILERS will be allowed in the INNER pit due to limited space. Please comply with this instruction.
 ALL TRAILERS must be parked in the designated trailer park.
 - Semi-trailers and transporters may park in the pit area under supervision of the Logistics Manager and DSP Chief Marshal and in accordance with the DSP layout.
- Competitors and their support crew vehicles are to obey the pit lane flow direction at all times.
 Refer SSR 303 [iii] & SSR 318 A [iii] d

32. REFUELLING

NB: THE PIT AREA IS A STRICTLY "NO SMOKING" AREA

- Competitors' attention is drawn to GCR 240, MSA Environmental Code Art 13 and 14 and SSR 316 regarding Refuelling Regulations. Attention is drawn specifically to the deployment of fire extinguishers. Refer SSR316 [ii]. Penalty 30 minutes.
- Competitors in Class Ultimate T1+ are reminded that 102 octane fuel must be ordered and paid for, from Amtec Lubricants, not later than Monday, 10 June Refer SSR Part 2 art 14 addendum 4
- The use of Environmental Mats during servicing and refuelling is compulsory.
 - IN THE CASE OF A CONFIRMED SPILLAGE, A FINE OF R1000.00 (one thousand rand) WILL BE LEVIED AND THE RELEVANT CREW/S WILL HAVE TO CLEAN UP THE SPILLAGE TO THE LANDOWNERS SATISFACTION AND PAY THE COSTS THEREOF. Refer MSA Environmental Code.
 - Environmental mats will be provided by SA Rally-Raid in the Parc Fermé to be used by cars with visible leaks. The mats will remain the property of SA Rally-Raid.
- Please note that no hazardous waste (empty fuel/oil containers) may be disposed of in the refuse bins. All empty
 containers must be removed from the pits/DSP and returned to your workshop for disposal. Refer SSR 316 [iv] and SSR
 318 A [x] f.

33. ENVIRONMENTAL

34. FINISH

The Finish of the TGRSA Safari 1000 will take the form of a Timed Control. Refer SSR 306 [i].

35. PARC FERMÉ AND POST RACE SCRUTINEERING

- Only driver and navigator permitted
- A Parc Fermé in accordance with GCR 252 will be in operation at the end of the Castrol Qualifying Races and Main races.
- The Organisers may, at their discretion, carry out post-race scrutineering checks. Refer: GCR 254.
- Technical Inspections may be carried out by the Technical Delegate if required by the COC.
- The Clerk of the Course may issue a written request to the TC to take fuel samples from race vehicles for comparison testing. Refer GCR 240 v)

36. TIME BAR

- The DSP Time Bar as per SR 8 whereafter no competitor will be allowed to commence another loop. Refer SSR 307 ii)
- End of Race Time Bar Refer SSR 307 [ii], SR 8
- The organisers could also calculate cut-off times at various Marshal Points and Check Points along the route. These cut-off times will be published in a bulletin and posted on the Virtual Notice Board. Competitors, who arrive at these cut-off points after the cut-off times, will be instructed by the Marshal to return to the pits via the most direct route.
- The organisers will not be responsible for sweeping or the medical recovery of any competitor who disregards a Marshals instruction in this regard.

37. SWEEPS AND RECOVERY

- A radio/phone sweep will be conducted of the route and sweep vehicles will be on standby if required to pick up stranded
 crew-members. Competitors are to note that the organisers are not obliged to provide a service for the recovery of vehicles
 or spares although they will endeavour to help where possible.
- Stranded racing vehicles and/or spares may only be recovered once racing has been completed.
 Furthermore, competitors/crews may only proceed onto the racing route after consulting with, and obtaining written authority from the COC. Refer: GCR 172 (iv) and (x), SSR 318 [x] f) and SR 20.

38. COMPETITOR CONDUCT

- ACCIDENTS/ INCIDENTS AND MEDICAL BOARDS: Refer SSR 317[i] & [ii]
- INCIDENT REPORT FORMS:
 - Electronic incident report forms are available from the link on the Telegram virtual notice board. These must be completed daily before the stipulated cut off time. Refer SSR 317 [iii]
- RETIREMENT: Refer SSR 317 [iv].
- RESPONSIBILITY: Attention is drawn to GCR 113 (xiv) regarding responsibility of persons associated with an entrant.
- INSURANCE:

The organisers pay a levy on behalf of every competitor towards a Public Liability insurance policy that MSA holds, in the amount of R 50 000 000.00 per claim. Every entrant, competitor, driver or person associated with the entrant who is directly responsible for a claim arising from any accident/incident on the event necessitating a claim against this policy will be liable for the first amount payable (excess) of R 25 000.00 per claim. Refer GCR113 xiv).

39. ROUTE, ROAD AND RAIL CROSSINGS:

- ROAD AND RAIL CROSSINGS: Refer SSR 309 and SSR 318 A [iv] b)
 - Competitors are reminded that it is compulsory to stop at all road/rail crossings.
 - Major road crossings will be Neutral Zones, indicated on RallySafe as well as DN/FN control boards.
- ROUTE: The Organisers have been afforded the privilege of staging this event in the area and are reliant on the goodwill
 of the local community. Please do not abuse their hospitality. We also rely on the local community to provide manpower to
 successfully run the event and we request that you, your crews, family and friends act responsibly in order not to alienate
 the community in any way.
- Competitors are to keep to the marked route and ensure they do not damage crops, veldt, plantations and natural vegetation.
- The unwritten rule of the road is that livestock and game, which may be encountered en route, have right of way at all times. If you kill or cause injury to any animal, the incident must be reported in writing to the first official/marshal you encounter.
- Competitors are obliged to stop and render assistance in controlling and extinguishing any fire on the route, whether it is a
 vehicle or vegetation.
- Passage through Populated Areas will be controlled as neutral zones. Refer 308.
 Area/s will be indicated by boards, road book and GPS/RallySafe.
- Action will be taken against competitors and/or their service crews, who are found to have travelled on private property
 either before, during, or after the event, and/or travelling on the demarcated racing route, without the written permission of
 the COC.
 - This will be strictly enforced! Refer GCR 113 xiv), GCR 172 (iv) and (x), SSR 311, SSR 318C.
- Crews are to be considerate towards landowners when retrieving stranded vehicles and/or spares from the route and are to ensure that damage to cultivated and grazing lands is avoided. Failure to comply will result in disciplinary action being taken against the crew concerned. It is important that crews familiarise themselves with the MSA Environmental Code in this regard. Refer GCR 113 xiv), GCR 172(iv) and (x) SSR 318 C [i] a).
- Any competitor who avoids or bypasses obstacles/ramps created in the Spectator Stadium Stage on the route could be penalised in terms of a minor deviation from the route. Refer SSR 318 A [ii] b).

40. PENALTIES

41. CLASSIFICATION AND RESULTS: REFER GCR 307, 197, 198 AND 200

 Subject to no protests being received in terms of GCR 200 viii), these classifications will become final 30 minutes later.
- Competitors' attention is drawn to Parts IX and X of the 2024 MSA GCR's regarding protests and appeals.

42. PRIZE GIVING: Refer GCR 121 (ix)

• The Awards Podium for the Castrol Qualifying Race and the SA Rally-Raid classes and Special Awards will be held, at a time to be announced, under the start/finish arch, on Sunday, 23 June 2024.

• SA Rally-Raid Championship Class Awards per round:

Awards for all classes (Ultimate, Adventurer, Challenger and SSV) will be based on the number of paid entries received at the closing of normal entries on the following basis - 1 to 3 in all classes

- Manufacturer's Team Award This is not the MSA Manufacturer Award, this is the on-event award.
- [i] The Manufacturer's Team Award will be made to the three highest placed finishers from the same brand, with the lowest aggregate time, based on the overall results of the event. .

 For the Overall Manufacturer's Championship, refer SSR 320.4.
- [ii] The manufacturer's team manager/representative will be presented with a trophy for the winning manufacturer.

Team of the Event Award

- [i] This award will be made to the highest placed two (2) vehicles from the same entrant with the lowest aggregate time when added together. In the event of a tie, the team with the highest position finisher will win.
- [ii] In the event there not being two (2) vehicles from one (1) entrant, the award will not be made.
- [iii] The team entrant/representative will be presented with a team trophy
- [iv] Excluding a team/s who represent a Factory Entry.

• Privateer of the Event Award

This award will be made to the three highest placed finishers excluding Factory Entries.

• FINISHER'S BADGES per round:

Finishers' badges will be presented to all competitors who are classified as finishers of each round. Refer SSR 307 [i]. Finishers awards to be collected when returning your RallySafe unit after completion of the event.

Special Awards may be handed out at the discretion of the Organisers.

43. RIGHTS OF THE COC, THE PROMOTERS AND THE ORGANISERS

- The COC reserves the right (subject to the approval of the Stewards) to –
- Alter the departure times and route if forced to do so through weather conditions
- Alter the starting and scoring methods if it is found necessary to do so
- The Promoters and Organisers reserve the right (subject to the approval of MSA) to –
- Postpone, abandon or cancel the event for reasons of 'force majeure'. Refer GCR's 62 and 244). In the event of
 postponement for more than twenty four (24) hours entrants will be refunded their entry fee. Refer GCR 109 (iv).
- Postpone, abandon or cancel the event if less than a total of 30 entries are received at time of entries closing.
- Refer GCR 99 (v)
- Refusal of any entry. Refer GCR's 99 (i) and GCR 100.
